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2020 Expectations for Years 5 & 6

Dear Years 5 & 6 students,

I am writing this special letter to you to remind you of your expectations as a member of our school. You should show it to and talk to your parents about it.

At Glendenning PS we have always encouraged you to be safe, respectful learners and now, as the senior students in our school, we expect you to be exemplary role models for other students. In helping others, you will also be helping yourself to become a responsible young Australian.

If you follow and adhere to these expectations, you will be able to attend activities such as discos, end of year movies, the Yr 5 or 6 camp and very importantly you will receive an invitation to the Yr 6 Farewell. Doing all of these things will ensure you receive very positive reports (with respect to your effort, participation and behaviour) and every opportunity to participate in school activities

Failure to meet expectations could lead to you being exempted from these activities. It is important for you to realise that, as Yrs 5 & 6 students teachers hold higher expectations of you than they will of other students – simply because you have been taught all of these expectations over the years and you as our leaders are expected to be exemplary.

The expectations we have for you are that you demonstrate our safe, respectful, learner values and always:

- Display safe (stay in bounds, act in a careful way, avoid things you know to be dangerous, keep your hands and feet to yourself, walk away from arguments), respectful (listen carefully, display polite manners, smile and be pleasant when talking, use a respectful voice, volunteer for additional jobs – not just for your usual teachers, but for all teachers including casual teachers), and learner (complete all work tasks, do your best, ask when unsure) values.
- Participate in ALL school activities, including swimming, cross country and athletics carnivals, excursions, Gala Day and other general school activities.
- Attending school regularly and on time (unless there is a genuine medical reason or a special requirement for you to be away)
- Wear school uniform
- Comply with the school's use of digital devices policy.
- Act in a way that brings credit to your school – on the way to and from school, on excursions, at carnivals, in assemblies – when interacting with parents or visitors at school – and for Yr 6 especially, when you visit your high school orientation in other words, at any time when you are dressed in school uniform
